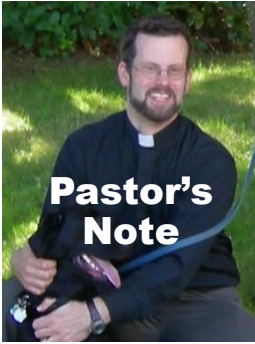

As the cell phone commercial used to say: "Can you hear me now?"

Well, for Sunday worship the answer is now "yes!"

If you didn't already know, I am pleased to spread the word that our new sound system has been installed and was tested at our Christmas services! The system is specifically designed with our needs in mind: in addition to the sanctuary, we'll be able to project sound to the gathering space and kitchen. Also, this system is specifically setup so that the other worshiping communities who rent from us can plug into it when they gather. While that might not sound like a big deal at first, this is actually incredibly useful as it means we can reclaim the storage space currently being used by the other groups' own sound systems (i.e. a lot of extra space gets used up when 4 churches each store their own speakers, mixing board, amplifiers, etc at the same site!)

In addition to the sound system, we'll be slowly incorporating the screens into worship during 2017. The exact form this will take is likely to evolve over time: in addition to "traditional" uses for screens such as projecting song lyrics or prayers, we will also experiment with using them to display art related to the day's worship. What final form their use takes remains to be seen, and I ask anyone with concerns to remain open-minded while we test this out. The ultimate goal is to use the new system as a tool for ministry. Like any tool, it has its appropriate and best uses - and we will be working together to figure out what those uses look like over the next several months.

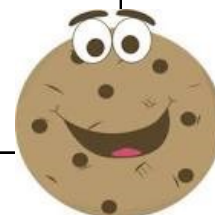

Excerpt from the letter from Tim Ault serving in Brazil



December 2016

Dear Family and Friends,

Greetings from Brazil! I praise God that Roxanne continues to do well physically: she is eating well, sleeping well, and experiences very limited agitation. Our first and only grandchild, Robert, at 6 months is enjoying his 1st Christmas this year. Our daughter Corrie and her husband Carlos are together with our other three kids for Christmas. It has been six years since they were last all together.



I've been thinking of those things for which I am thankful to our loving Father:

- Roxanne goes to sleep well every night.
- She wakes up well every night at 3:00 AM when I get her up to use the bathroom. She is cooperative, she sits quietly in a chair if I need to change the bedding, and she lies back down again and sleeps!
- Roxanne wakes up at a reliable time each day, allowing me the opportunity to have a much needed walk each morning.
- Corrie and Carlos are a wonderful support for us here.
- We have the loving support of our families, both mine and Roxanne's.
- God continues to bless me with good health.
- He has provided us with the perfect house for Roxanne's needs.
- We have many folks in Brazil and in the US praying for us personally and for our ministry.
- Everyone in Asas and MAF is fantastically supportive and understanding of our needs.
- We have an amazing team of ministry partners who give sacrificially of their finances to support us in our ministry.
- God has graciously allowed me to continue to play a significant part in the spreading of His Kingdom in the remote areas of Brazil through our contribution to the ministry of Asas de Socorro.
- Our Lord has given us a very caring and patient caregiver for Roxanne. Without her help I wouldn't have time for ministry.
- I am so thankful that we have such a joyful and astonishing salvation. It wouldn't have to be that way, but our loving Father has chosen it to be so, and it blesses me.
- I am thankful for the fellowship of believers.
- And I am especially thankful for the celebration of Christmas when all of this came down to earth.

1 Our prayers are filled with awe and thanksgiving for the power and majesty of God reflected in all of creation, the universe and each other—wonderfully created, diverse human beings.

2 In this new year, we ask God to open our hearts and minds to newness and change, knowing that whether we succeed, struggle or fail in our endeavors, the love and forgiveness we have in Jesus Christ never waivers.

3 Mentors encourage, teach by example and walk alongside us. We give thanks to God for mentors who inspire our faith and help us develop skills, wisdom and confidence for navigating the complexities of daily life.

4 We remember in our prayers synod bishops gathered for the Bishops' Academy that they grow in faith and wisdom as leaders of our church and are strengthened in their support of one another for the work and ministry to which they have been called.

5 The wonder and joy of the birth of Jesus continues long after Christmas. We give thanks and praise daily for God's everlasting, undeserved gift of love.

6 *Epiphany of Our Lord* We give thanks and praise to God for revealing to the world Jesus Christ, Son of God—our true salvation, hope and light.

7 As the newness of Christmas gifts wears off, we ask God to center us in the lasting gifts of faith in Christ, caring relationships, supportive communities, and love and forgiveness—given and received.

8 *Baptism of our Lord* Through the waters of baptism and word of God we are welcomed lovingly into the body of Christ and set forward on a new path as children of God. We pray the Holy Spirit will remind us daily of our baptismal mission, stir our faith and be an ever-present guide for us as we share the gospel and serve our neighbor.

9 We remember in our prayers college and university students who are on winter break, involved in J-term studies or service learning that they be renewed for continuing their studies, know the mutual blessings of community service and further discern how God is calling into use their deepening knowledge, experiences, skills and passions.

10 For people—of all ages—who suffer with depression, especially during this time of the year, we pray for relief, hope, appropriate skilled care, supportive relationships and communities, and healing.

11 We give thanks to God for traditions of the past that still carry meaning and value for us and for traditions that are shifting or being newly formed as the world changes and we are moved by God's creative power and presence.

12 The ELCA strategy for Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities (AMMPARO) is rooted in concern for the plight of children forced to flee their communities, particularly in Central America and Mexico. We ask God to help us be bold and wise in our compassion and actions, responsible partners in finding solutions and work together as welcoming congregations for the sake of those who are most vulnerable—children and families.

13 We remember in our prayers our elders, those who are ill, and people who struggle with mobility who are homebound or living in places of care and pray that we are mindful of including them in the life of our congregations and affirming their value as brothers and sisters in Christ.

14 Uncertain of what awaits us each day and what the year ahead holds for us, we ask God to grant us courage, hope and wisdom for facing the challenges and tasks that take us by surprise.

15 Just as Jesus' disciples shared their experiences and introduced others to him as the promised Messiah, we pray that we are enthused to go out of our way to share with people our faith and the good news of Jesus Christ.

16 *Martin Luther King Jr. Day* We remember in our prayers people, past and present, who stand and advocate with humility and courage for the rights, well-being and value of all people—God's people—who suffer injustice, mistreatment, neglect or oppression.

17 We are grateful to God for our global partners, companion churches and international leaders throughout the world and pray they continue to grow and flourish in their outreach and ministries for the sake of the world and the spreading of the good news of Jesus Christ.

18 Today begins the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, and we pray for reconciliation and unity among all Christians, embracing our common identity as members of the body of Christ, children of God, called to share the gospel and serve our neighbor—together.

19 We remember in our prayers youth ministry leaders gathered for the ELCA

Youth Ministry Network's Extravaganza in Louisville, Ky. We give thanks to God for their gifts and commitment to faith formation and the well-being of children, youth and families.

20 *Inauguration Day* On this day we remember in our prayers President Donald J. Trump and the people elected or chosen to serve and guide our nation. We pray they will be enabled to serve with wisdom, compassion, justice, skillfulness and humility for the prospering and health of our nation, diverse communities and global relations.

21 Elders sometimes feel more isolated during the winter months. We pray for insight for creating meaningful ways to help our elders stay connected with family, friends and community, as well experience the joy of new relationships.

22 Just as the fishermen Peter, Andrew, James and John dropped what they were doing in response to Jesus' invitation to follow and serve, we pray that we too are quick to follow, ready to learn and eager to serve as disciples of Christ.

23 We offer thanks and praise to God for being our salvation, light, strength and shelter throughout life and in every circumstance.

24 We pray we are not hesitant to live as active, concerned members of society, that our actions, words and influence reflect God's word and will for the world.

25 In the conversion of Paul we see God at work in the least likely of people. We pray that we recognize how the Spirit stirs us and are attentive to the surprising ways in which God is at work in the world.

26 We remember in our prayers the leaders of our 130 outdoor ministry sites and 85 outdoor ministry organizations making plans for summer programs and seeking staff who will serve—in the name of Jesus Christ—people of all ages, abilities and backgrounds.

27 We thank God for women who respond to God's call and pursue lives of service and witness as missionaries, rostered ministers, lay leaders, theologians and teachers.

28 We give thanks to God for educators, scholars and theologians throughout history who have helped us mature in faith through prayerful study, exploration and discussion of Scripture and theology, and discover the intertwining of faith and everyday life.

God is "Too"...

Faith and Everyday Life

"Too"

"Too" is an adverb meaning – 1: in addition, 2: more than enough, 3: to a regrettable extent, 4: extremely or too much or too many.

It doesn't seem like much of a word, but it will provide a key this year to exploring the heights of God's grace and the depths of our human struggle to live with each other.

Let's try it out with definition 4, "extremely." "That was too funny!" It makes no sense literally, but if we understand the idiom we discover that someone finds something *very* humorous. As a matter of fact, it was so funny there may not have been words to describe it. We are eavesdropping on a private moment between two people and there is a positive relationship implied here. The "too" carries a sense of intimacy and sharing.

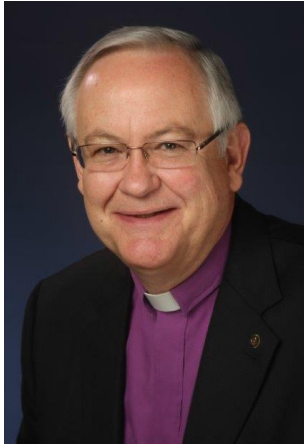
The words "God is too gracious and forgiving!" is not criticizing God's generosity, but recognizing God's extreme love for people. In this positive relationship, God's very essence has flowed through and to someone and they are expressing awe and gratitude.

Try it out for yourself. Use the "too" word once a day with definition 4 (until family and friends get tired of it). See how this little word might expand your experience of what is large in God's universe and of what might be enlarged between you and the people around you.

Saying "Yes" to a New Year

...if you have faith as small as a mustard seed you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you.

+ Matthew 17:20

How well do you know yourself? Are you a person who more times than not is saying YES to the opportunities that come your way or are you a bit more cautious and likely to say NO. I began life as a real low risk taker and either flat out said no to any invitations that created is comfort for me or made up excuses as to why I couldn't participate. This ran the gamut from being invited over to a friend's house to spend the night to something even more challenging like trying to water ski. I felt it better to play it safe than risk the embarrassment of failure.

I have made some improvements over time but I must confess, I still live life with too much caution and only occasionally push myself beyond my comfort zone. The challenge of being too cautious is it really limits the size of one's world.

I had an uncle from Duluth who came to visit us in Seattle. He was so miserable being away from home that I doubt he ever ventured out again. Duluth is a nice place but a pretty small geographic area to call your world.

God has never seemed content in allowing people to settle for a smaller world. Our God is the God of adventure -who throughout history has constantly uprooted us a people, calling us to ventures yet unknown.

Venturing beyond the world in which we are safe allows us to learn what it means to put our trust in

God. I learn this lesson every time I move beyond my fear -whether it is rappelling off the side of Pinnacle Peak near Mt. Rainier, showing up as a police chaplain at a homicide scene, or traveling through Northern Ethiopia. (Not to mention allowing my name to be placed into nomination to serve the Office of Bishop.)

I must say, as a parish pastor I watched the congregations I served struggle with taking risks. It is far easier for governing bodies to say no than it is to say yes. I finally challenged the Church Council to saying yes to everything that came before them unless it was in violation of the mission or core values. If it was an issue that required funding beyond what was in the budget than we shifted the challenge back to the people who wanted to make something happen to figure out a way to fund it.

Our leaders were amazed that over and over again God came through when we were willing to put more and more on the line. We started to do things that we never imagined we could do. Don't get me wrong, not everything worked out. We had our failures along the way. But, I'd rather fail than simply be content with the way things have always been.

Learning to say yes is a tremendous stretching exercise. It doesn't mean we can always pull it off-but it sure makes our world bigger just by entertaining the possibilities and imagining where the Spirit might lead us.

As we enter 2017, I want to encourage you to become aware of what your tendencies are when it comes to the opportunities that are presented. Let 2017 be the year that you lean in the direction of considering YES before too quickly saying no. Believe me, it will add to your sense of adventure and hopefully strengthen your faith in God.
