Frequently Asked Questions About: The Call Process

Where are we in the process?

On Wednesday, October 24, the Call Committee, the Council, and staff met with our <u>potential</u> new pastor, Diakonda Gurning. Diakonda will be meeting with the Bethel congregation this Sunday, October 28, for a "meet and greet."

What happens next?

Between now and November 18, the Call Committee will meet with the Synod to discuss the appropriate next steps (dotting the I's and crossing the T's).

Sunday, November 18, Congregational Meeting to vote on the 2019 budget and whether or not to extend a call to Diakonda Gurning. Dianne Johnson will be with us while we cast our votes.

Can I hear the candidate preach?

(on Wednesdays, we have the After-School students here for much of the day)


Diakonda will not be able to deliver a sermon here at Bethel. He is a mission developer so the call process is a little different from calling a traditional pastor. A mission developer is called to a congregation for a single year and the call process is somewhat expedited.

Why has the process been so secret?

The Call process is held in strict confidentiality in order to maintain the privacy of individuals. When a pastor seeks a call to another congregation, he or she will want to keep that information confidential until another call appears to be forthcoming.

How can I help?

Keep praying for the call committee, the candidate, and Bethel. Ask good questions and open your heart. Know that we are on the journey together and Christ is with us!





Putting the Garden to Bed

Harvest-time is over; it's time to put the garden to bed. But first, we plant bulbs! CPPC students and Sam, a gardener from Aaron's Place, planted spring bulbs in the raised beds in Bethel's backyard. Gardeners learned about the parts of a bulb and how food is stored in the layers surrounding the flower inside. They planted tulips, a few small daffodils and crocus, pointy end pointing toward the sky. Next, they covered the bulbs and corms with a blanket (a layer of soil), and finally, one more blanket (a layer of fall leaves). The little gardeners were reminded that bulbs need to be tucked in for the winter some sang lullabies and wished the spring bulbs "sweet dreams!"

The annual Holly Berry Luncheon will be **Saturday, December 8, at 11:00am** here at Bethel.


This year's entertainment will be music provided by Bronn Journey, an acclaimed classical harpist.

Gratitude

One of the great joys of owning our boat is how

many people comment on her name. When we are out on the water people will often pull along side and shout out, "I love the name of your boat." We hear this same comment dockside and from neighbors who walk by the house where we store the boat.

What is it about the name Gratitude that elicits such a response? It certainly wasn't the case with our first boat. It was named C-Sick and we received very few comments.

I only have hunches as to why it strikes such a strong chord with people. The most obvious is we live in such a cynical world that more often expresses complaint and criticism before it expresses gratitude. People delight in hearing a word of appreciation.

Gratitude is acknowledgement that one has received gift in their life.

Gratitude is the discovery that enough is more than plenty.

Gratitude is the recognition that we have received that which we do not deserve. Gratitude is heartfelt - down in one's bones - appreciation and thanksgiving for the daily gifts that we receive.

God's people from the beginning of time have been taught to be people of gratitude. We most often express our gratitude through feasts. We gather around tables filled with plenty to give God thanks for delivering us from slavery to freedom, and from death to life.

St. Paul discovered that when you approach life out of a sense of gratitude it allows you in all circumstance to fill content. Even in times of need or when one has little. In such times one still knows that we are being provided for.

I love being around grateful people. They are always people of joy and promise. Their posture is humble, and their lives are filled with appreciation. They are often people who have been through the most difficult of times and they tend to see the best in everything.

I am so grateful as your Bishop that so many of you are people of Gratitude.

May you be strengthened this Thanksgiving by knowing that God continues to provide us all that you need to be content.
