Last month we spent so much time being with our community in Shoreline and from what I saw and heard we have so much room for improvements and I have talked to some of you to do more engagements with our neighborhood in the near future.

## News from the 2019 Churchwide Assembly



Our denomination, the ELCA, holds a churchwide assembly triennially - to worship, vote on matters of governance and policy, and be church together for the sake of the world. This past week's churchwide assembly was full of important votes and actions, including:

- Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton was reelected for a second six-year term on the first ballot.
- A declaration of apology to our siblings of African descent, which was received by the African
  Descent Lutheran Association with thanks and a call for accountability and living into the words
  shared.
- Approved resolution declaring the ELCA is a "sanctuary church body," encouraging participation in the ELCA AMMPARO initiative for migrant children, discernment of care for our immigrant neighbors in our context, and the promise of forthcoming resources for this work.
- Approved support for the World Council of Church's Thursdays in Black, awareness movement for a world without rape and violence.
- Voted to commemorate June 17 as a day of repentance, in honor and remembrance of the martyrdom of the Emanuel 9.
- Approved a declaration for inter-religious commitment, reaffirming ecumenical and interfaith partnerships.
- Approved the recommendations from a strategic taskforce which has been studying how to work toward authentic diversity in our church.
- Approved memorials: affirming but not "endorsing" the Poor People's Campaign, care for immigrants and refugees, and other statements.
- Adopted a new social statement, "Faith, Sexism, and Justice: a Lutheran Call to Action," and its implementing resolutions.
- Deacon Sue Rothmeyer was elected Churchwide Secretary, a full-time position which acts as executive administrator and leader on all constitutional matters and interpretation.
- Constitutional change for Deacons (rostered ministers of word and service) to be ordained, from the previous practice of consecration.
- Celebrated the milestones of 50 years of women's ordination, 40 years since the first woman of color was ordained, and 10 years since full inclusion of LGBTQIA+ clergy.

#### **Update from Tom & Mary Holman**

The one-volume publication of the first five books of the Old Testament in Anufo has been completed, and the team has taken delivery of the books! **Praise God. Thank you** for praying! We hope to have our own copy for you to see when we come to visit. **Pray** that the stories of God's chosen people and his dealings with them in these books will touch the hearts of the Anufo, including those who still follow their traditional religion and those who follow the other majority religion in the area.

Tom is helping the Anufo team with exegetical issues in 1 Samuel. Second Samuel is also ready for checking. He is also helping the L team in Nigeria make 1-2 Timothy and James ready for printing as well as making preparations to check the rest of Matthew with them in October.

The Waja team and I are making progress on 1 Corinthians because the internet connection has been good lately. **Pray** for good health and strength for them as they work on 1 Corinthians and other books in preparation for our visit there from October 3-26.

#### From the Bishop The Spirit -September 2019

On August 3, as I prepared to fly to Milwaukee for the 2019 ELCA



Churchwide Assembly, I looked out the airplane window at Mt. Rainier and thought, "Wow! Is there anything more spectacular?" And, I admit, I also thought, "I have so much work to do right here in the synod, why do I have to leave for a week?"

On August 12, as I prepared to leave Milwaukee to return home, I looked out the airplane window at Lake Michigan and thought, "Wow! I am both so proud of our church and also so aware of how much further we have to go!"

I hope that you were able to follow the Assembly in real time by watching the livestream. But even if you weren't able to follow the assembly in real time, I encourage you to read about the people elected, the motions that were passed, experience the worship, and hopefully, enter into the joy that happens when we are *church together* (which was the theme for this year). It truly was a blessing to be with over 1000 Lutherans as we did good and hard work this past week.

In the coming months I will reflect more on some

of the motions and actions that happened at the Churchwide Assembly. But here are a few thoughts as I return home. We are connected to a deep and broad community throughout the United States. We are people of different ethnicities, cultures, colors, sexualities, and genders. We are young and old. We are from blue and red states. We are people who are Lutherans from birth and we are people who embraced the Lutheran lens of Christianity later in life.

We are a people who are listening to God's call to embrace all people, even when it is difficult or uncomfortable. We are a people who ask forgiveness when we mess up and we are a people of grace. We are a people who march against unjust laws and we are a people who sing of that promised day when all will be made right. We are a people who ask many questions and we are a people who reflect on words spoken. We are a people who try (as best we can) to follow Robert's Rules of Order and we are a people who laugh when no one can figure out the rabbit hole we have gone down as we attempt Robert's Rules of Order. We are a people who sing old and wellknown hymns with gusto and we are a people who embrace new words and new melodies in this new day.

In short, we are people of God. We don't always get it right. We don't always agree. But God's Spirit was present and active in Milwaukee just as
